Student Fund Update

Bryan Bodien of Milwaukee and Boston continues studies toward his Master of Divinity at Holy Cross Theological School in Brookline. He also completed studies at St Herman's Seminary in Kodiak, Alaska and Hellenic College with honors.

Gregory Vreto, Jr of Philadelphia, a young attorney, has successfully completed the St Stephen's Course of study. His ordination to the diaconate has been approved by the OCA's Commission on Vocations in Syosset and is expected to take place in the coming year.

Professor Dennis Nagi of Albany is completing his final semester in the Late Vocation Program with superlative grades and is expected to be ordained to the diaconate in June.

Anthony Gjonej of Detroit (and Shkoder) is now enrolled at the Seminary in Durres, Albania. He continues to keep in communication with Bishop on his progress.

The Synaxis of Archangels Michael, Gabriel & All Heavenly Hosts

The Synaxis of the Chief of the Heavenly Hosts, Archangel Michael and the Other Heavenly Bodiless Powers: Archangels Gabriel, Raphael, Uriel, Selaphiel, Jehudiel, Barachiel, and Jeremiel was established at the beginning of the fourth century at the Council of Laodicea, which condemned and denounced as heretical the worship of angels as gods and rulers of the world, but affirmed their proper veneration.

A Feastday was established in November, the ninth month after March (with which the year began in ancient times) since there are Nine Ranks of Angels. The eighth day of the month was



chosen for the Synaxis of all the Bodiless Powers of Heaven since the Day of the Dread Last Judgement is called the Eighth Day by the holy Fathers. After the end of this age (characterized by its seven days of Creation) will come the Eighth Day, and then "the Son of Man shall come in His Glory and all the holy Angels with Him" (Mt 25:31).

The Angelic Ranks are divided into three Hierarchies: highest, middle, and lowest.

The Highest Hierarchy includes: the Seraphim (who stand closest of all to the Most Holy Trinity), the Cherubim (who stand before the Lord after the Seraphim) and the Thrones (who stand after the Cherubim).

The Middle Angelic Hierarchy consists of three Ranks: Domin-

ions (who hold dominion over the angels subject to them), Powers (who fulfill the will of God without hesitation), and Authorities (who have authority over the devil).

The Lowest Hierarchy includes the three Ranks: Principalities (who have command over the lower angels, instructing them in the fulfilling of God's commands), Archangels (who are messengers of great and wondrous tidings), and Angels (who are in the lowest rank of the heavenly hierarchy, and closest to people).

All the Ranks of the Heavenly Powers are called angels, although each has its own name and position by virtue of their service. The Lord reveals His will to the highest ranks of the angels, and they in turn inform the others. Over all the Nine Ranks, the Lord appointed the Holy Archangel Michael (his name in Hebrew means "who is like unto God"), the faithful servitor of God, as Chief Commander.
