Father Stephen's Message to the Faithful

The Lenten Spring

Finally comes the last day, usually called *Forgiveness Sunday*, but whose other liturgical name must also be remembered: *The Expulsion of Adam From The Paradise Of Bliss*. This name summarizes indeed the entire preparation for Lent.

By now we know that man was created for paradise, for knowledge of God and for communion with Him. Man's sin has deprived him of that blessed life and his existence on earth is exile.

Christ, the Savior of the world, opens the door of paradise to everyone who follows Him, and the Church, by revealing to us the beauty of the Kingdom, makes our life a pilgrimage toward our heavenly Fatherland.

Thus, at the beginning of Lent we are like Adam: Adam was expelled from paradise through food; sitting therefore in front of it he cried, "Woe is me... One commandment of God have I transgressed, depriving myself of all that is good; paradise holy! Planted for me. And now because of Eve, closed to me; pray to thy Creator and mine that I may be filled again by Thy blossom."

Then answered the Savior to him: "I wish not my creation to perish; I desire it to be saved and to know the Truth; for I will not turn away him who comes to Me."

Archbishop Demetrios Appeals for Help for Victims of California Mudslides

December 30, 2003 - New York – Responding to the tragedy that occurred on Christmas Day at St. Sophia Greek Orthodox Camp in San Bernardino, CA, His Eminence Archbishop Demetrios, Primate of the Greek Orthodox Church in America, has issued an urgent appeal to be read in all parishes of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America. In this appeal he requests that a special offering be made on Sunday, January 4, 2004, to benefit the families of the victims who perished during the mudslides that ravaged the area of San Bernardino.

His Eminence Archbishop Demetrios, expressing his deepest sorrow for the tragic loss of this large number of people said, "We were deeply saddened by the tragedy in San Bernardino. The

unexpected and harsh death of so many people, on Christmas Day, is a shocking reality that is not easily confronted. The Orthodox Church, though, which has faced innumerable tragedies and sorrows throughout the centuries, has always immediately run to the disaster sites and human pain and has offered unreserved assistance."

The Greek Orthodox camp is located in Waterman Canyon of San Bernardino, which had recently been ravaged by fires that destroyed all vegetation and woods in the area contributing to the latest tragedy, which caused the death of at least fourteen people at the Campsite.

A disaster relief fund has been established to assist those who have lost family members. <u>The Mudslide Victims Fund</u> will be administrated by St. Sophia Cathedral in L.A. All funds will be directed for the benefit of the families of the victims. Checks should be made payable to "Saint Sophia Cathedral" with the words "*Mudslide Victims Fund*" written on the memo line and sent to: Saint Sophia Cathedral, 1324 South Normandie Ave., Los Angeles, CA 90006.

The first finding came to pass during the middle years of the fourth century, through a revelation of the holy Forerunner to two monks, who came to Jerusalem to worship our Saviour's Tomb. One of them took the venerable head in a clay jar to Emesa in Syria. After his death it went from the hands of one person to another, until it came into the possession of a certain priestmonk named Eustathius, an Arian. Because he ascribed to his own false belief the miracles wrought through the relic of the holy Baptist, he was driven from the cave in which he dwelt, and by dispensation forsook the holy head, which was again made known through a revelation of Saint John, and was found in a water-jar, about the year 430, in the days of the Emperor Theodosius the Younger, when Uranius was Bishop of Emesa.
